
To Run or to Walk, that is the question...

Also, Please note that you must follow the City of Worthington's ordinance for Garage Sales. – Excerpt below.

757.03 PERMIT APPLICATION; FEE; FREQUENCY OF ISSUE. Application for such permits shall be submitted to the City

Clerk and must be approved by the Director of Safety prior to issuance after a fee of two dollars (\$2.00) is paid. Only one such permit shall be issued for a single address in any twelve-month period and shall be valid for not more than three consecutive days or two consecutive weekends of two days each. (Ord. 24-73. Passed 4-9-73.)

757.04 SALE ADVERTISING. A sign announcing the sale may be erected only on the premises at which the sale is being conducted and shall be erected only for the duration of the sale. The sign or placard may be no larger than four square feet and must be without illumination, movement or illusion of movement.

757.06 APPLICATION DEADLINE; SALES AFTER SUNSET PROHIBITED. Application for such sale shall be made at least seven days in advance of the first day of the sale. No sale shall be conducted either in whole or in part after sunset. (Ord. 62-73. Passed 8-27-73.)

Course about Colonial Hills to be taught at OSU - Historic Preservation Studio Fall Quarter, 2011

Our neighborhood is going to be the subject of an entire course at OSU this fall. Pretty Cool. This is an excerpt to from OSU's course book for the Fall, "Resources of the Recent Past – Exploring the Colonial Hills Neighborhood in Worthington, Ohio.

Historic Preservation professionals are beginning to research, document and evaluate the "Resources of the Recent Past," dating from 1940-1970. These mid-20th century resources are all around us – how do we understand their history and development, evaluate them for significance, assist property owners and communities to appreciate them? This course will be focused on the Colonial Hills neighborhood in Worthington. Students will be given the opportunity to be on the leading edge of this trend in historic preservation.

The community was platted in 1927, but the first 200 houses were not built until the early 1940's to provide worker housing for World War II industries. An additional 500 houses were built in the decade following the end of the war. The Colonial Hills Civic Association was founded in the late 1940s and is still active today. The class will research and document the neighborhood, explore the historical and physical context of the neighborhood in Worthington, and will evaluate whether or not the neighborhood might qualify for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. Students will become familiar with recent work by the National Park Service and the Ohio Historic Preservation Office on how to evaluate the significance of properties from this time period; will research and document the builder/developer, the property types, and physical layout of the neighborhood; will analyze how this neighborhood differs from the adjacent areas of Old Worthington and Rush Creek Village; will conduct interviews with long-term residents and local historians; and will produce a publication and a presentation of results to be scheduled for a public meeting at the end of the quarter."

Have you found your "niche" in the




Some before and after photos, and Information about our Neighbor's
