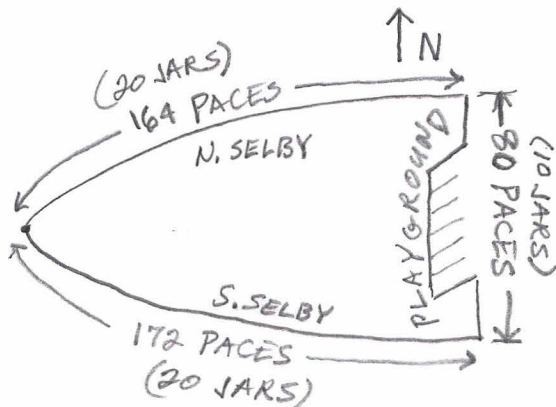


CHCA Surround Selby Park Luminary Placement Instructions, 12/20/2009

WTP: I counted my fast-walking paces (approximately one yard/pace) around the perimeter of Selby Park, as documented in the drawing below.

The calculation for the spacing of luminary jars is as follows:
416 total paces divided by 50 luminary jars = 8.32 paces/luminary.

It was found that placement at approximately 8 paces per luminary works fine, and your placement would be OK if you simply placed the luminaries approximately equidistant using this value.

However, the following refinements to such placement are suggested:

- 1) Place the first 10 (or so) luminaries for the Andover side of the playground at locations just inside the curb (on the grass or non-grass surface as the case may be), such that there is a pleasant-looking continuity for this configuration. That is, you can visualize a string running beside the sidewalk, connecting the luminaries and which makes some almost right angles when it crosses the sidewalk into the playground area just west of the parking spaces. Some luminaries will be slightly closer than 8 paces, some slightly farther apart.
- 2) Then, with the remaining 40 (or so) luminaries, start at the western tip of Selby Park, and place approximately 20 luminaries for North Selby, improvising in your spacing for a slightly higher density of luminaries close to the tip, and a slightly lower density east of the entrance to the blacktop. Adjust the placement so as not to place a luminary right beside a sign post.
- 3) Finish with the remaining 20 (or so) luminaries, in a similar placement along South Selby.
- 4) You should find that you complete the placement with an over/under of just one or two luminaries. Optionally, go back and adjust the spacing/placement of luminaries "per taste," as the holiday spirit moves you, analogous to one's use of slightly more or fewer ornaments in decorating a Christmas tree.
