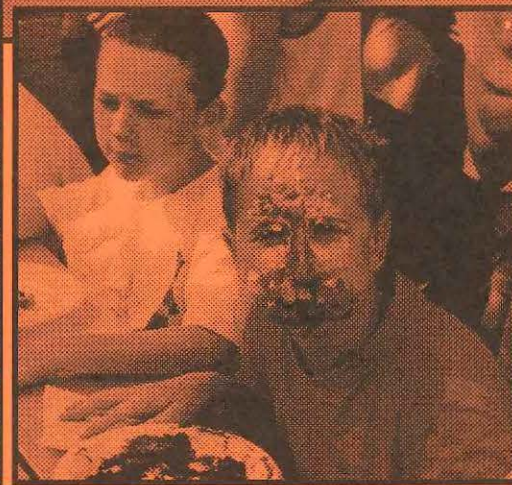
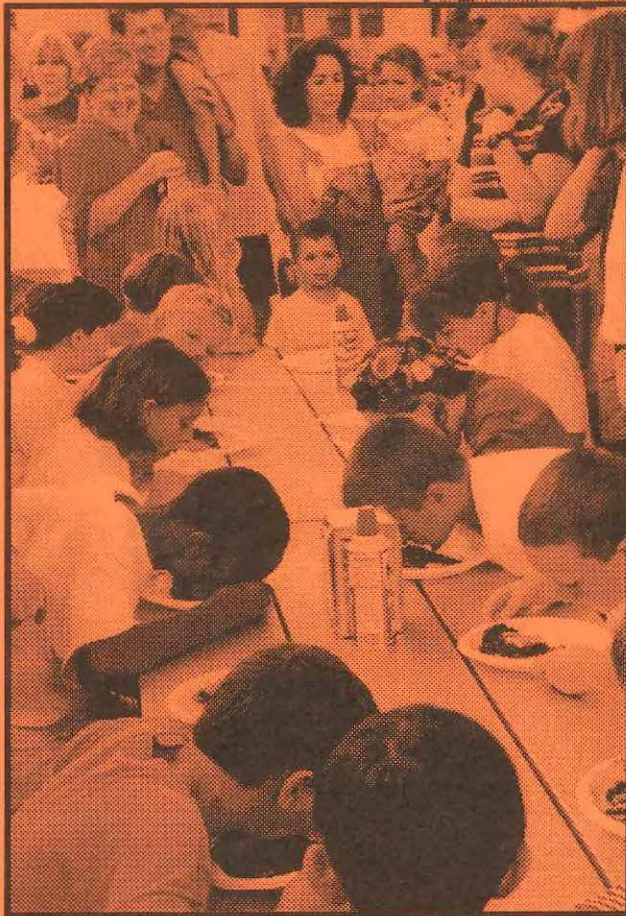
## 5K "Run Through The Hills" Results
