The following recipe comes from Market Day, and uses their diced chicken tenderloins.


<p>Ingredients</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1 Tbls butter or margarine 1 cup celery slices 1 cup carrot slices 1 48-oz. can chicken broth, defatted 1 cup chopped onions 2 cups sliced mushrooms 1 14.5 oz. can stewed tomatoes 1 6 oz. Pkg. Wild rice 1 lb. Diced Chicken tenderloins. 	<p>Directions</p> <p>Melt butter in a 5 quart Dutch oven. Add Celery, onion and carrots; cook 4 minutes. Add mushrooms; cook 2 minutes. Stir in remaining ingredients. Bring to a boil. Cover; reduce heat simmer 25 to 30 minutes or until rice is tender.</p> <p>Makes 10 servings.</p>






