The Popsicle man would beckon us with this ringer bell on his handlebars and when we heard the bells we bounded out the door with whatever change we could grab from our piggy banks or Moms purse. The old fashioned Ice-cream Tricycle with the large freezer box on the front preceded the Ice Cream Truck era and I remember that back then the driver would stop and spend more time with the kids because it was a slower moving process. I remember 'The Little Store' which was there for years servicing our candy needs. And then there was the sound of the trains and train whistles coming from the tracks running parallel to Indianola Ave. Guess the folks who live there now experience the same sounds.

There was a time during the 1950s when my greatest adventures included trying to make a complete U-turn on Park Blvd.- riding my HUGE

Schwinn Bike. I kept crashing into the curb and wiping out so my parents got me a smaller, less glamorous bike, but one that I could actually ride!

It was a quieter time back then. They were still developing the new housing at the bottom of Park Blvd. and planting new trees. It's been an interesting life experience to watch the entire neighborhood blossom through the years, especially the tree covering which makes Colonial Hills (and all the way down Selby Blvd.) so very impressive. We loved the High School dances at Selby Park. I remember on one occasion TVs Gene Fullen hosted a dance party in the summer of 1961 and my classmate Linda Shufflebarger and I won a jitterbug or twist contest. Linda received a gift but they ran out of one for me so...Pizzon (Genes sidekick) gave me his prized Bongo Drums which he then had to replace on the TV show. That was a fun Selby Park and Colonial Hills Memory.
