
Greetings and Happy Spring, Colonial Hills Friends and Neighbors!

EASTER EGG SET UP, EASTER EGG HUNT, AND RAIN DATE





WORTHINGTON THRIFT STORE

Everyone loves bargains, the thrill of finding that designer brand or unique treasure for the home at a special price. Colonial Hills is fortunate to have a little shop just around the corner that might have that special something that will make your shopping day successful. For over forty years, the Worthington Thrift Shop at the corner of Selby and High St, 5600 High St., has provided Colonial Hills shoppers a spot that can fulfill their wishes.

The slogan "reduce, reuse, recycle" seems current, but over 54 years ago a group of Worthington women decided to support the cause of national cancer research by opening a resale shop. In 2006 fundraising efforts shifted to the Columbus Cancer Clinic, an arm of Lifecare Alliance, to focus efforts locally. Local volunteers from Colonial Hills and Worthington, Clintonville and other neighborhoods work together to keep the shop stocked with the latest merchandise, acquired through consignments and donations.

Donations are accepted at the back door in the alley from 1-4 Tues-Fri and 10-4 Saturday. They welcome your donations of gently used clothing, household items such as linens, dishes, pots and pans, small appliances, working electronics and décor. Just ring the doorbell at the back door and the donation team will spring into action. The volunteers will take in a small box or a trunk load of bagged donations. Sorting the donation to ensure that the highest quality goes on the sales floor, volunteers are always amazed by the unusual items that come in. As one volunteer commented: "It's like a treasure hunt in donations- we get everything from trinkets to Tiffany. Donations are our lifeblood."

Another important service that the Shop offers is consignment. You can bring in your gently used items during consignment hours and take home some cash when they sell. This is a popular feature of the Shop's fundraising efforts. Consignors can bring in 12 items to consign, with a 50/50 split in profits. Consignment days are Thursday 1-3 and Saturday 10-12. They always welcome new volunteers, as volunteers are the core of the shop's success. Current volunteers come from the wider community- Worthington, Clintonville, Columbus, Dublin, Lewis Center, and Powell, all drawn by their desire to help the fight against cancer, as well as to enjoy the friendships that grow when working together for a common cause. Some volunteers work behind the scenes on days the shop is closed, while others assist consignors or work at the sales desk. Students from Bishop Watterson come to help for community service credits, as do students from other high schools and colleges. SCHOLARSHIP



- 3) Write a 2-page (double spaced) essay about the Colonial Hills neighborhood that answers the questions- Why do you love living here? What role has your community played in your development?

 AND
- 4) Volunteer at two (2) Civic Association events OR Complete a (Civic Association pre-approved) neighborhood project.


For the volunteer requirement, there are MANY opportunities throughout the year BUT you need to get on it ASAP! Apply now!


