Greetings, Dear Colonial Hills Neighbors and Friends,



# LUMINARY SET UP AND THANKS

The Colonial Hills Civic Association (CHCA), Worthington, wishes to express their great appreciation for the generous gift of a box of 2000 plastic grocery bags donated on November 17, 2023, by the Kroger Charitable Donations Organization, Mr. Mark Bruce, Corporate Affairs Manager, the Kroger Company. This box of 2000 bags are 200 more than what we need every two years, and completed the other necessary supplies which the CHCA purchased for our luminary kit assembly event Saturday, December 2, in which we assembled 901 luminary kits for the 838 homes in our neighborhood – each kit containing 5 pounds of pea gravel, 5 tealight candles and 5 white lunch sacks.

For our neighborhood Luminary Display night, Sunday, December 10, again another string of heavy-raining days miraculously ceased, and the weather that evening permitted residents to comfortably walk the luminary-lined streets, admiring the outstanding holiday decorations their neighbors had put up, in celebrating the season and in hopes of bragging rights with a winner's sign in their yard, for the upcoming Holiday Decorating Contest, Tuesday, December 19.

As I very slowly drove every street, I observed high luminary participation on all streets, with long expanses of continuous luminaries on the Selbys and Indianola, and again, as in previous years, some streets had virtually 100% participation, such as Meadoway and Park Overlook.

And thus, finally, I must thank every neighbor who set out their luminaries, to complete our wonderful Colonial Hills holiday decorations!

# SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Inflation is everywhere. You see it in the prices at the grocery store, the gas pump (ok, that one is a bit more of a roller coaster), property taxes, cost of construction, tuition.... We feel it in our pocket books. But you know what has outpaced inflation? The amount of money your Colonial Hills Civic Association has increased their scholarship! 83%!!! The CHCA has awarded over \$5,000 dollars the last two years and looks to continue that streak with our 2024 Scholarship award.

# SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINE APRIL 4TH

What do you need to do to get in on the action? Just apply, dear neighbors, apply. The completed application MUST be received by April 4 and you can find the application on colonialhills.us. You can deliver your application either in person or to be received via the CHCA e-mail address (CHCA.worthington@gmail.com).

For the volunteer requirement, there are MANY opportunities coming up during this spring season. DON'T MISS OUT! If you cannot make a volunteer date already set up, see a CHCA officer to talk about how you can fulfill via a neighborhood project! Make sure you enjoy the JOY of being part of this neighborhood community... and get a little something extra if you are headed into a continuing education program!

### Colonial Hills Civic Association Scholarship Application

The following are eligibility requirements and conditions for the Colonial Hills Civic Association Scholarship:

- 1) The applicant must be a current resident of Colonial Hills, Worthington, Ohio and a graduating high school senior during the current year or someone pursuing continuing education.
- 2) The Scholarship may be used for all types of educational programs beyond high school (e.g., college, vocational, technical, and business institutes).
- 3) The Scholarship must be used within one (1) calendar year of the award and will be made available in a lump sum payment upon proof of enrollment in an academic or vocational program and proof of residency in Colonial Hills, Worthington, Ohio.
- 4) The applicant must complete this form for consideration. Final selection will be the sole decision of the Colonial Hills Civic Association. All information will be kept confidential except essay question response(s).
- 5) The completed application must be **received by APRIL 4th**, and can be submitted by any of the following methods. Mail entries must be postmarked by April 1st and sent to CHCA, PO Box 676, Worthington, OH 43085. You may also bring your application to a Civic Association meeting, or deliver it to the current CHCA Secretary (by April 4).

  Optionally, you may also submit by e-mail as follows: Attach your completed application to an e-mail sent to CHCA.Worthington@gmail.com; your e-mail must have a timestamp before midnight April 4th. Although the CHCA will reply to confirm receipt of your application via e-mail, please save your sent e-mail until you receive CHCA confirmation that we received it.
- 6) The application must be signed by the student and parent/guardian(s). For an e-mail submission: By PDF, please make sure your attached scanned PDF has the signature lines completed. Or with an attached Word document, please scan in either PDF or JPEG photo format the page with signature lines, and then also attach this scanned or photographed page, in addition to attaching your Word document.

# IN MEMORIAM: CHRISTINE HAYES

### Christine (Chris) [Ramona Moon] Hayes

August 25, 1947 - January 5, 2024

In mourning her passing, we honor one of the CHCA neighborhood trustees who always served with a smile. Christine had extraordinary character and personality. You could not help but be attracted to her, nor forget her. Christine's intelligence, perceptive instincts and artistic creativity all existed at uncommon levels. She established her own unique presence, spreading love and warmth--with a sharp wit-among thousands of children and adults across her lifetime.

Preceded in death by her parents, Betty and Ben Hayes, cousin to Woody Hayes, Christine is survived by her son, artist Lucian Archimedes Moon Hayes.



As a child, she attended many notable events in Central Ohio thanks to her father's career as a newspaper columnist with The Citizen-Journal. At age 6, Christine was named Ms. Ohio State Fair in 1953. In 1956, her family moved from a country farmhouse into an original Rush Creek Village home in Worthington, Ohio. Her mother, a seamstress, sewed most of the original Rush Creek homes' curtains for the world's largest community of Frank Lloyd Wright styled homes ever built.

Upon graduation in 1965 from Worthington High School, Christine moved to Southern California to study theatre at the University of California-Irvine where she received a B.A. degree in 1968. The amazing breadth of Christine's talents included: Montessori teacher, dramatist, playwright, actress, set-designer, poet, columnist, author, bibliophile, historian, and diarist (including lucid dream logs). But above all, she was an artist. In California, she adopted the artist's name Ramona Moon, and became one of the first 1960s artists to work only with recycled materials to produce collaged art in 2- and 3-dimensional works. Most celebrated among her collage pieces are her art cars, one of which may be seen in the courtyard of GoreMade Pizza in Columbus. Indeed, her art cars have appeared in films by Harrod Blank as well as in his book Wild Wheels.

Christine was one of the early social influencers of the burgeoning hippie movement. "She was iconic," in San Francisco, reported a friend in 2023. Christine worked back stage at many famous music concerts, such as 1967's Summer of Love concerts and the Monterey Pop Festival, and later on Helms' Tribal Stomp events. She would persevere in living out her values embracing love, art, fun, non-violence, vegetarianism and justice. Case in point, was Ramona's annual Bolinas Solstice Festival and the Sausalito Arts Festival which featured her larger than life-size puppets. Out of Ramona's annual beach events, and others in the Bay Area, would emerge the idea for Burning Man. She continued to pass along her love and knowledge of the arts as a deeply loved Montessori teacher for the Marin Horizon school; wait lists developed for families wanting their kids to be taught by Christine!

Moving back into her Rush Creek Village home at the end of the 1990s, Ramona organized Columbus' first

art car show on April Fool's Day, 2000, at Dan Dougan's Little Brothers' music hall in the Short North. Her presence with her art car(s) at art events, parades like the Doo Dah, and festivals like Comfest and Hot Times made her widely known. In Columbus, Ramona would re-establish her collage-art studio, first in Couchfire Collective's Junctionview Studios and then inside BrickBox Studios. One of her artistic commissions was part of a collectively-created mural for the new Mt. Carmel Women's Health Center St. Ann's in Westerville.

On her return to Columbus, she wrote columns for The Short North Gazette, which may be found at www. shortnorth.com. An original member of Columbus' The Aldus Society, dedicated to knowledge of books, Christine served as its secretary for seven years. In 2011, she contributed the Foreword to Look to Lazarus. The Big Store written by the Meyers family. With co-author Doug Motz, she published two editions of Lost Restaurants of Columbus in 2015 and 2017. And the latest with Motz, her last book, is the soon to be published A History Lover's Guide to Columbus.

Throughout her life, Christine had an uncanny connection to the natural world, books and the arts. Despite later financial challenges, she continued to support such causes, and requested that such be continued after her stroke on July 3, 2023 which left her severely disabled. For those who wish to make a contribution to her memory, Bread & Puppet Theater in Glover, Vermont, and The Nature Conservancy are two groups that she especially supported. Surely, the staff who cared for her at Mt. Carmel Rehabilitation Hospital, Wesley Glen Health Center and Ohio Health Hospice deserve everyone's gratitude—even in her highly disabled state, care staff fell in love with her!

If nothing else is taken away from remembering an extraordinary neighbor, take a moment to get to know your neighbors. Everyone has a story worth telling and sharing, especially in this special neighborhood.



# EASTER EGG HUNT





# BUDDY BOX PACKING EVENT

One of the wonderful things about being in a neighborhood that has a school in the midst is the ability to serve the school in practical ways. One of those ways we have chosen to serve as the Colonial Hills Civic Association is to partner with the Family Mentor Foundation's Buddy Box program. We had to reschedule our last event and are so excited to get to partner with them again.

# SUNDAY, MARCH 17, FAMILY MENTOR FOUNDATION

Many children who qualify for free lunch or reduced fee lunch at their

schools have little to eat at home and return to school after weekends distracted by their hunger and unable to focus on learning. Family Mentor Foundation's goal is to bridge the gap; to send these kids home with a Buddy Box every Friday during the school year to alleviate their hunger. A Buddy Box is a box filled with kid-friendly, nutritious, nonperishable, individual sized-food items that are easy for children to eat or prepare on their own. These meals and snacks help sustain the children on the weekends when they are not in school.

Sunday, March 17th at 1:00 PM, we will head over to the Family Mentor Foundation and pack boxes to help prepare a portion of the over 1,500 boxes they serve every week. Last time we almost packed 1,000 boxes! Let's beat it this time! We have space for 20 volunteers. # LONG LIVE SELBY PARK

The council-appointed Parks and Recreation committee (Steve, Alex, Darren, Colleen, and Ryan) came to discuss a proposal at the last Civic Association meeting, which stemmed from a 2017 overall plan for all parks and the Selby playground, for a POD "people-oriented design" renovation of the shelter house. The committee's goal was to gather input for the proposal.

Steve and Alex asked questions, such as "What would you like to see changed?" and "What would a new building look like?" Factors like disability-accessible indoor/outdoor restrooms and air conditioning were discussed as well as shelter house design, more space to host events, indoor/outdoor flow, and storage areas for CHCA event materials for events like our 4th of July celebration.

The encouraging thing is that the city is clearly interested in helping maintain what makes Selby Park special. Simplicity and service to the community is of utmost importance. Any changes that the city will make, will take community input and work to make the space serve the community. Some priorities will be preserving the open field, the walking loop, and large trees. The committee shared that there is to be an open house to look at concepts in March. So stay tuned, stay involved!
