Greetings and Welcome to 2026!!

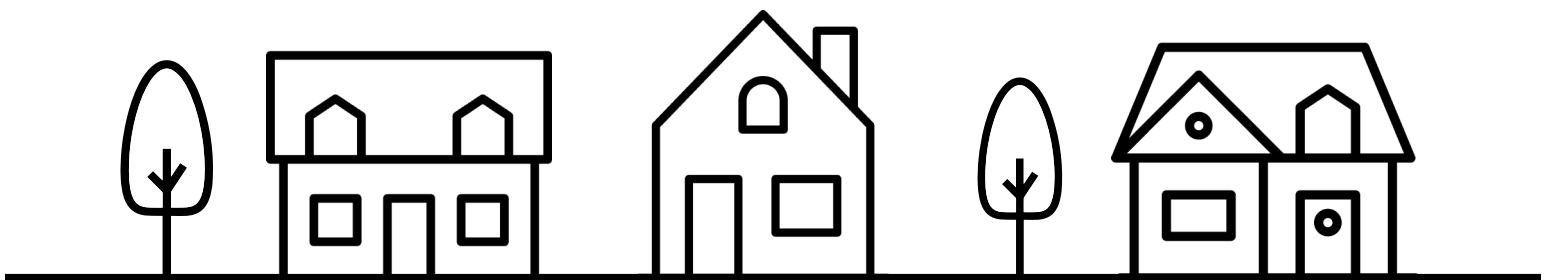

2025 LUMINARY SET UP AND THANKS

The Colonial Hills Civic Association (CHCA), Worthington, wishes to express their great appreciation for the generous gift of a box of 2000 plastic grocery bags donated on October 13, 2025, by the Kroger Charitable Donations Organization, Mr. Mark Bruce, Corporate Affairs Manager, the Kroger Company. This box of 2000 bags are 200 more than what we need every two years, and completed the other necessary supplies which the CHCA purchased for our luminary kit assembly event Saturday, December 6, in which we assembled 902 luminary kits for the 826 homes in our neighborhood - each kit containing 5 pounds of pea gravel, 5 tealight candles and 5 white lunch sacks.

And the CHCA wishes to greatly thank our two Luminary Event sponsors for their very generous donations for this event: The Roof Detective and Erin Hunt Glowacki, the Powell Buehler Group.

Also, I want to heartily thank each of the 34 volunteers, including 12 youth, who assembled all these kits in a record-tying time this year of around 10:50 AM! Please see the photos which show the fairly good weather for our volunteers that day, which was one of the few dry days in the previous week.

And I cannot thank enough our CHCA Trustees, who delivered the luminary kits to each home in their district (plus their year-round work in delivering our Courier newsletters and CHCA membership packets, and some of whom have additional roles within the CHCA) - and many trustees also volunteered for luminary kit assembly. And I must thank Al Smyth, who has continued since 2014 to backstop our event, by delivering to nine trustees who were not able this year to pick up their bundles of kits by 1:00 PM on Saturday, including one delivery to all the homes in one district!

Mother Nature, year after year, inexplicably (knock on wood) had given us fairly, if not completely, no-raining, non-heavily snowing, and unseasonably mild days, for both Kit Assembly Saturday and Luminary Display Sunday. This year for Luminary Display Sunday, Mother Nature gave us two out of three of these conditions, including no noticeable wind - but eliminating the effect of the polar vortex was not possible - so it was a frigid 7 degrees. Thus, although the night was fine for the luminary display itself, it took some resolve on the part of our residents to make it happen.



But, braving the cold, a very high percentage of residents set out their luminaries - although the bone-chilling temperature prevented folks from getting out and walking the streets to enjoy the luminary and holiday decorations handiwork of their neighbors. And although I observed while driving each street that it was not the festive night it usually is, anyone out and about that evening was treated to wonderfully continuous displays of luminaries on many streets - for instance, on E. Selby all the way from the apartments and condos to around Foster, plus the virtual 100% participation on Meadoway, Park Overlook, E. Southington, the west, cul-de-sac end of Loveman, and portions of Indianola and Park Blvd.

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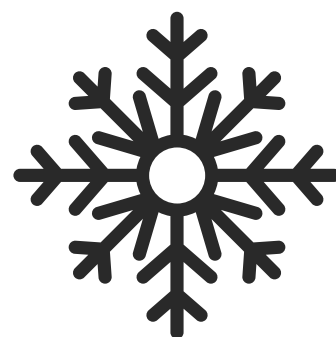
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2025 COLONIAL HILLS HOLIDAY DECORATING CONTEST

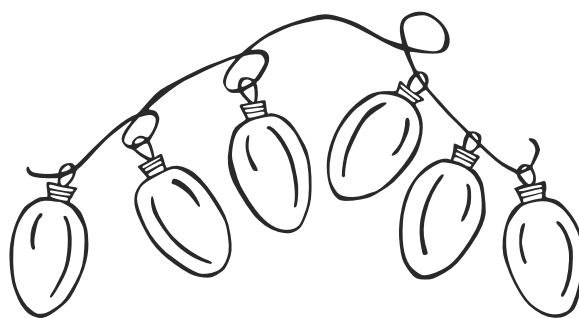
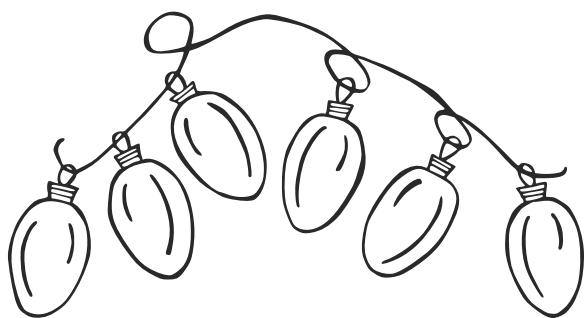

- 2) Submit one (1) letter of recommendation from an adult who knows you well and has worked with you in a relevant capacity. AND
- 3) Write a 2-page (double spaced) essay about the Colonial Hills neighborhood that answers the questions – Why do you love living here? What role has your community played in your development? AND
- 4) Volunteer at two (2) Civic Association events OR Complete a (Civic Association pre-approved) neighborhood project.

For the volunteer requirement, there are MANY opportunities coming up during this spring season. DON'T MISS OUT! If you cannot make a volunteer date already set up, see a CHCA officer to talk about how you can fulfill via a neighborhood project! Make sure you enjoy the JOY of being part of this neighborhood community... and get a little something extra if you are headed into a continuing education program!

Colonial Hills Civic Association Scholarship Application

The following are **eligibility requirements** and conditions for the Colonial Hills Civic Association Scholarship:

1. The applicant must be a current resident of Colonial Hills, Worthington, Ohio and a graduating high school senior during the current year or someone pursuing continuing education.
2. The Scholarship may be used for all types of educational programs beyond high school (e.g., college, vocational, technical, and business institutes).
3. The Scholarship must be used within one (1) calendar year of the award and will be made available in a lump sum payment upon proof of enrollment in an academic or vocational program and proof of residency in Colonial Hills, Worthington, Ohio.
4. The applicant must complete this form for consideration. Final selection will be the sole decision of the Colonial Hills Civic Association. All information will be kept confidential except essay question response(s).

Submission Guidelines

1. The completed application must be received by **APRIL 4th**, and can be submitted by any of the following methods. Mail entries must be postmarked by April 1st and sent to CHCA, PO Box 676, Worthington, OH 43085. You may also bring your application to a Civic Association meeting, or deliver it to the current CHCA Secretary (by April 4).

Optionally, you may also submit by email as follows: Attach your completed application to an email sent to CHCA.Worthington@gmail.com; your email must have a timestamp before midnight April 4th. Although the CHCA will reply to confirm receipt of your application via e-mail, please save your sent email until you receive CHCA confirmation that we received it.

2. The application must be signed by the student and parent/guardian(s).
For an e-mail submission: By PDF, please make sure your attached scanned PDF has the signature lines completed. Or with an attached Word document, please scan in either PDF or JPEG photo format the page with signature lines, and then also attach this scanned or photographed page, in addition to attaching your Word document.

The applicant must complete the following:

1. Attend a Colonial Hills Civic Association meeting **OR** Interview a CHCA Officer.

AND

2. Submit one (1) letter of recommendation from an adult who knows you well and has worked with you in a relevant capacity.

AND

3. Write a 2-page (double spaced) essay about the Colonial Hills neighborhood that answers the questions- Why do you love living here? What role has your community played in your development?

AND

4. Volunteer at two (2) Civic Association events **OR** Complete a (Civic Association pre-approved) neighborhood project.

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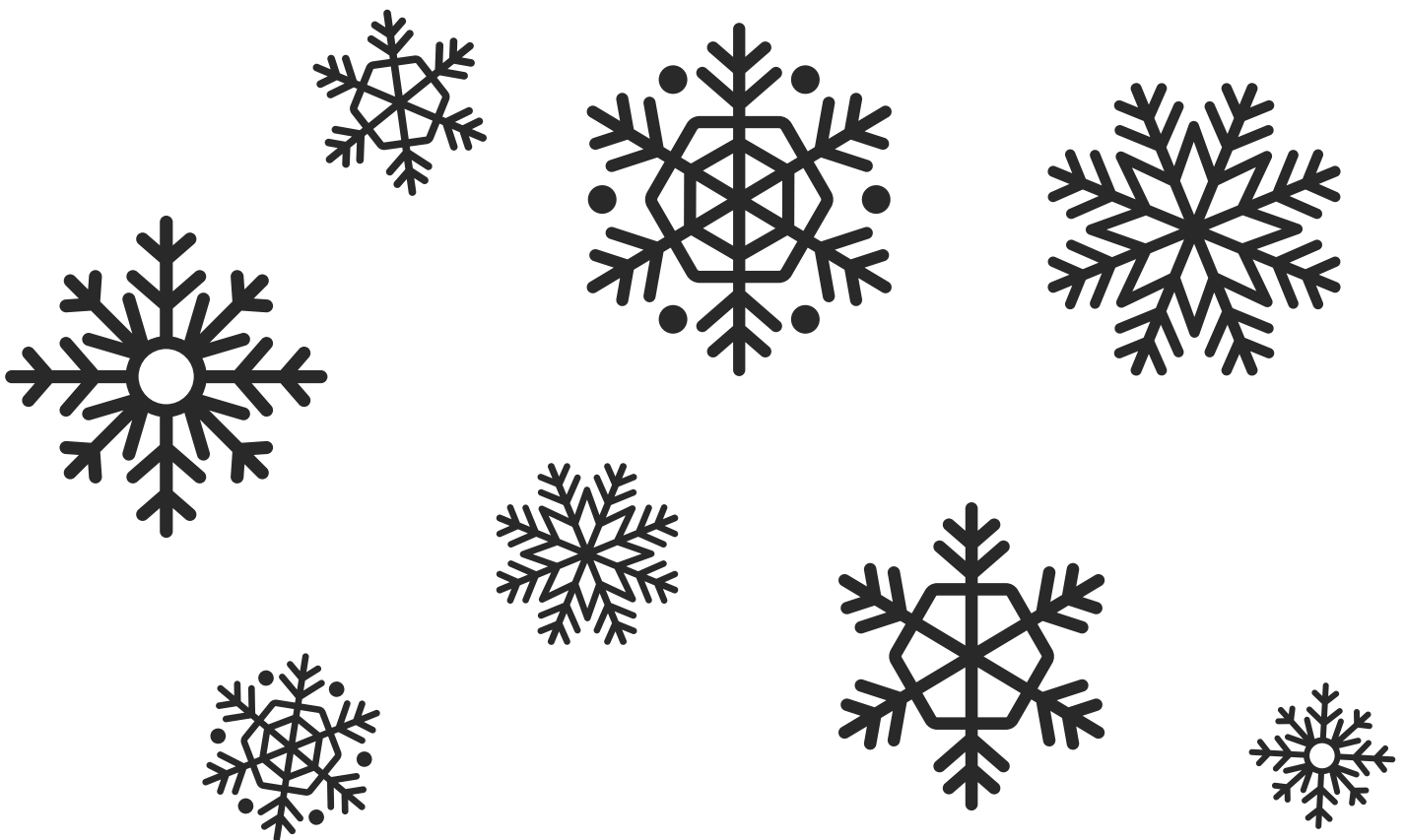


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THANK YOU TO OUR WELCOME BAG CREATOR/DELIVERER
