

COLONIAL HILLS CIVIC ASSOCIATION MEETING MINUTES - 9 JULY 2019

The Colonial Hills Civic Association met at 7:30 pm on 9 July 2019 at the Shelter House at Selby Park. Present were officers Emma Lindholm, President; Alan Miroslaw, V/P Events; Dave Nadolny, Treasurer; John Cecil, Secretary. Also present were: Ron Sears, Rachel Dorothy, AJ Perry and Tim Nittle.

The minutes from the 11 June meeting were distributed. Mary Ann Ogle made a motion to accept them, seconded by Tim Nittle, and the motion carried.

Dave Nadolny presented the Treasurer's Report. He reported that there is \$2,430.00 in checking (not including 4th of July revenue), and \$4,469.00 in savings, which includes \$1,000.00 in a "rainy day" fund, and the remainder dedicated to the sign campaign. Additionally, he reported that 206 households have paid membership dues, which is up 18 households over this time last year. He will provide a complete financial report once he has incorporated revenues from the 4th of July Event.

As a wrap up to the 4th of July Event, AJ, Jenny and Alan all must be recognized for their efforts. Rachael Dorothy suggested that next year's dunk tank should include a "Police vs. Fire Department Challenge". She said we need more volunteers to be dunked. Dave Nadolny reported that, despite some changes, expenses were roughly the same this year as last. It was suggested that we either need better signage for the beverage donation, or move it to the Shelter House window, where many went to look for water. (after counting cash, dave said revenue was approximately \$1,100.) We discovered that there is a need to engage children between 10 and 16 to either volunteer or participate. We concluded that activities should begin immediately after the conclusion of the Kiddie Parade. Mitchell Button should be recognized for his efforts. AJ Perry said she would do a recap for Facebook about the Pie Baking contest, and Emma said she would post about the watermelon eating contest. Emma suggested we find better ways to communicate the day's schedule. She suggested a hand held schedule of events. We wanted Will Pearce to find a way to link photos of the event to the website.

The October Courier will be mailed. Deadline for content is the end of September. Included will be the new scholarship application, the recycling guide from Dave's daughter, possibly Ron Sears' neighbor article, and a preview of Halloween activities, including the house decorating contest.

Ron Sears reported that David Robinson had a forum to discuss the project near the old children's home.

Rachael invited all to participate in the Worthington International Pot Luck at Selby Park on 25 August from 4 - 7 pm.

Alan Miroslaw discussed his "Meet your Neighbors" event at Front Porch Growler on 28 August, from which the CHCA will receive revenue. If this is successful, he will arrange others.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 pm.
