

COLONIAL HILLS CIVIC ASSOCIATION MEETING MINUTES - 13 AUGUST 2019

The Colonial Hills Civic Association met at 7:30 pm on 13 August 2019 at the Shelter House at Selby Park. Present were officers Emma Lindholm, President; Alan Mirosław, V/P Events; Dave Nadolny, Treasurer; John Cecil, Secretary. Also present were: Ron Sears, Rachel Dorothy, and Bonnie Michael.

We received a thank you card from scholarship recipient Megan Zalenski.

The minutes from the 9 July meeting were distributed. Dave Nadolny made a motion to accept them once a typo was corrected. The motion was seconded by Tim Nittle, and the motion carried.

While some pointed out that there was a minor typographical error on the new scholarship application and instructions, we agreed that this was to be the final revision, ready for implementation. It was noted that our recipients usually come from Thomas Worthington H.S. All of the information with regard to the scholarship will be in the Courier.

Dave Nadolny presented the Treasurer's Report. He reported that there is a balance of \$6,765.00 in the checking account, and \$4,495.00 in savings. He has preserved \$1,000.00 for a "Rainy Day Fund" from the savings account; the remainder is dedicated to the new entry signs. (As of this meeting, there is \$3,494.00 in the sign fund.) Dave also reported that, if there was no additional revenue collected, we would have around \$3,000 after expenses. He did recommend that because the 4K race lost money, we should ask our sponsors for more money. Also, he reported that our membership campaign is at 237 households, and revenue is up by \$600. Interestingly, the Porch Growler event netted \$201. Lastly, Dave reported that someone is helping us anonymously to resolve our tax filing issue.

Dave also reported that his wife is standing by to work on entry sign design, but has not yet received any specifications to begin work.

The October Courier is scheduled to be mailed. Articles are due 21 September. There will be color photos on the front and back pages. Emma Lindholm proposed that we devise a new Courier schedule. It was also suggested that Trustees deliver all but one to save on postage.

The Porch Growler neighborhood social was a success. The \$201 netted was apparently 20% of the take.

The Halloween events are being handled by their Chairs.

Bonnie Michael, current City Council member (and also candidate for reelection), spoke briefly about some issues relating to our neighborhood.

Ron Sears reported that he went to Microcenter to see if they would participate in our scholarship, and that is pending. Ron also discussed his new Neighborhood Development group - formed to keep tabs on the Boundless property redevelopment.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:17pm.
